A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO REDUCE ENERGY, FUEL, AND WATER CONSUMPTION IN THE 2 3 STATE THROUGH: (1) DEVELOPMENT OF A PLAN TO INCREASE THE AVAILABILITY AND USE OF ALTERNATIVE FUELS IN STATE-OWNED 4 5 VEHICLE FLEETS: (2) PROVISION OF ENERGY ASSISTANCE TO 6 LOW-INCOME PERSONS; (3) DEVELOPMENT OF A STRATEGIC PLAN TO 7 EXPAND THE BIOFUELS INDUSTRY IN NORTH CAROLINA; AND (4) 8 MECHANISMS TO ENERGY STUDY **IMPROVE** AND WATER 9 CONSERVATION IN STATE-OWNED FACILITIES.

16 **SECTION 1.** In order to promote attainment of the twenty percent (20%) reduction or displacement of petroleum products consumed in State-owned vehicle 17 18 fleets by January 1, 2010, as required by Section 19.5 of S.L. 2005-276, the Department 19 of Administration shall develop a plan for the targeted conversion of fuel dispensing 20 facilities to provide greater availability of biodiesel, ethanol, and other alternative fuels. 21 The Department shall consult with affected State agencies to identify measures to 22 increase the efficiency and cost-effective utilization of resources and consider this 23 information in the development of the plan. The Department of Administration shall 24 submit the plan to the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations no
