SENATE BILL 991*

Short Title: Authorize Judge/Concealed Weapon in Cths. (Public)

1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT A DISTRICT COURT JUDGE OR SUPERIOR
3 COURT JUDGE WHO HAS A CONCEALED HANDGUN PERMIT MAY
4 CARRY OR POSSESS A CONCEALED HANDGUN WHILE IN A
5 COURTHOUSE TO DISCHARGE OFFICIAL DUTIES.

6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 14-269.4 reads as rewritten:

8 "**§ 14-269.4. Weapons on State property and in courthouses.**

9 It shall be unlawful for any person to possess, or carry, whether openly or concealed,
10 any deadly weapon, not used solely for instructional or officially sanctioned ceremonial
11 purposes in the State Capitol Building, the Executive Mansion, the Western Residence
12 of the Governor, or on the grounds of any of these buildings, and in any building
13 housing any court of the General Court of Justice. If a court is housed in a building
14 containing nonpublic uses in addition to the court, then this prohibition shall apply only
15 to that portion of the building used for court purposes while the building is being used
16 for court purposes.

17 This section shall not apply to:

19 (1a) A person exempted by the provisions of G.S. 14-269(b),

21 (4a) Any person in a building housing a court of the General Court of
22 Justice in possession of a weapon for evidentiary purposes, to deliver it
23 to a law-enforcement agency, or for purposes of registration,

24 (4b) Any district court judge or superior court judge who carries or
25 possesses a concealed handgun in a building housing a court of the
26 General Court of Justice if the judge is in the building to discharge his
27 or her official duties and the judge has a concealed handgun permit
28 issued in accordance with Article 54B of this Chapter or considered
29 valid under G.S. 415.24.

1 (5) State-owned rest areas, rest stops along the highways, and State-owned
2 hunting and fishing reservations.

3 Any person violating the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a Class 1
4 misdemeanor."

5 **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
