



1 other member of a fire department covered by this section, all hours are counted during  
2 which the firefighter or other member of a fire department is required to remain on call  
3 on the employer's premises or so close to the employer's premises that the person cannot  
4 use those hours effectively for that person's own purposes. Hours in which the  
5 firefighter or other member of a fire department is required only to leave a telephone  
6 number at which that person may be reached or to remain accessible by radio or pager  
7 are not counted in. In computing the hours in a workweek or the average number of  
8 hours in a workweek during a work cycle of a firefighter or a member of a fire  
9 department who provides emergency medical services, vacation, sick time, holidays,  
10 time in lieu of holidays, or compensatory time may be excluded as hours worked.

11 **SECTION 2.(d)** A firefighter or other member of a fire department may be  
12 required or permitted to work overtime. A firefighter or other member of a fire  
13 department other than supervisory personnel who is required or permitted to work  
14 overtime as provided by subsections (a) and (b) of this section is entitled to be paid  
15 overtime for the excess hours worked without regard to the number of hours worked in  
16 any one week of the work cycle. Overtime hours are paid at a rate equal to 1-1/2 times  
17 the compensation paid to the firefighter or member of the fire department for regular  
18 hours.

19 **SECTION 2.(e)** This act applies only as to municipalities with full-time paid  
20 firefighters.

21 **SECTION 3.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
