2	AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO ESTABLISH A COST SHARE
3	PROGRAM TO ASSIST NORTH CAROLINA FARMERS WHO SUFFERED
4	DAMAGE FROM THE SEVERE AND EXTREME DROUGHT CONDITIONS IN
5	NORTH CAROLINA IN 2007 AND, IN FURTHER RESPONSE TO THE 2007
6	DROUGHT, TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF
7	AGRICULTURE AND CONSUMER SERVICES TO ASSIST THE GREEN
8	INDUSTRIES AND TO ESTABLISH AND SUPPORT A POSITION TO
9	COORDINATE A STATEWIDE AGRICULTURE RESPONSE TEAM, AS
10	RECOMMENDED BY THE JOINT SELECT COMMITTEE ON THE
11	AGRICULTURAL DROUGHT RESPONSE.
12	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
13	SECTION 1.(a) Agricultural Drought Response Cost Share Program. – The
14	Agricultural Drought Response Cost Share Program is established. The Program shall
15	provide grants to assist North Carolina farmers who suffered damage from the severe
16	and extreme drought conditions in North Carolina in 2007. These grants shall be used to
17	assist farmers with the following projects:
18	(1) To redrill damaged wells or to drill new wells to be used as a water
19	supply for livestock or for irrigation.
20	(2) To renovate damaged or inadequate farm ponds or construct new farm
21	ponds to be used as a water supply for livestock or for irrigation.
22	(3) To renovate pastures depleted by the drought.
23	SECTION 1.(b) Program Administration. – The Program shall be
24	administered by the Division of Soil and Water Conservation in the Department of
25	Environment and Natural Resources through the Agriculture Cost Share Program for
26	Nonpoint Source Pollution Control. The Division shall administer this Program as

16			b.	Applicants shall be limited to farmers who have an adjusted
17				gross income in each of the previous two years that is at or
18				below two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000), unless at
19				least seventy-five percent (75%) of this adjusted gross income
20				is derived directly from farming, ranching, or forestry
21				operations.
22			c.	To be eligible for grant funds under subdivision (1) or
23				subdivision (2) of subsection (a) of this section, applicants must
24				demonstrate that their existing water supplies are insufficient to
25				provide reliable water to meet current needs for livestock
26				watering or irrigation.
27			d.	Applicants may apply for grant funds for projects under
28				subsection (a) of this section that were installed as of August 1,
29				2007, so long as the costs of installation are documented to the
30				satisfaction of the Division.
31			e.	The term of the grant contract shall be one year, but the contract
32				may include an option to extend the grant beyond the one-year
33				period to a farmer who needs additional funds to achieve the
34				purpose of the initial grant.
35			f.	The requirements and limitations under subdivisions (1), (2),
36				(5), (7), and (8) of subsection (b) of G.S. 143-215.74 do not
37				apply. All other limitations and requirements set out in Part 9 of
38				Article 21 of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes, as modified
39				by this section, apply.

of improving the efficiency of the system.

- 3 (3) Establish criteria for the selection of applicants who are eligible for 4 participation in the Program. Priority shall be given to applicants who 5 have substantially complied with federal and State laws, regulations, 6 and rules for the protection of the environment, natural resources, and 7 public health and who have a limited ability to pay for the projects that 8 are eligible for grants under subsection (a) of this section.
  - (4) Develop a process for soliciting and reviewing applications and for selecting farmers to participate in the Program.
  - (5) Investigate and pursue other funding sources to supplement State funds, including federal, local, and private funding sources.
- 13(6)Provide technical assistance to participating persons to assist with the14projects that are eligible for grants under subsection (a) of this section15and to facilitate the timely transfer of technology among participating16persons.

SECTION 1.(d) Advisory Committee. – The Department may establish an
advisory committee to assist the Division with the implementation of this act.

19 **SECTION 1.(e)** Report. – No later than 1 October of each year, the Division 20 shall prepare a comprehensive report on the implementation of Sections 1 through 4 of 21 this act. The report shall be submitted to the Environmental Review Commission as a 22 part of the report required by G.S. 143-215.10M. The first report required by this 23 subsection shall be submitted to the Environmental Review Commission no later than 1 24 October 2009.

25 **SECTION 2.** Account. –The Agricultural Drought Response Account within 26 the Department of Environment and Natural Resources is established. Funds in the 27 Account shall be used only as provided in Section 1 of this act. The Account shall 28 consist of funds appropriated to the Account by the General Assembly; any federal 29 funds available for this purpose; and any grants, gifts, or contributions to the State for 30 this purpose. Funds in the Account shall not revert. Further, twenty-five percent (25%) 31 of the funds in the Account shall not be allocated during the initial funding cycle, but 32 shall be retained to be allocated by the Division of Soil and Water Conservation 33 consistent with the limitations under this act, for the purposes under this act, and to 34 address future drought emergencies or to allocate to farmers who received a grant under 35 this act who need additional funds to achieve the purpose of the initial grant.

**SECTION 3.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Agricultural Drought Response Account the sum of five million two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$5,250,000) for the 2008-2009 fiscal year to implement the Agricultural Drought Response Cost Share Program. Notwithstanding the provisions of G.S. 143-215.74 regarding the permissible uses of funds under the Agriculture Cost Share Program for Nonpoint Source Pollution Program, these funds shall be allocated as follows:

(1)	\$750,000 shall be used to assist farmers in redrilling damaged wells or
	drilling new wells to be used as a water supply for livestock or for
	irrigation.
(2)	\$500,000 shall be used to assist farmers with the renovation of
	damaged or inadequate farm ponds or the construction of new farm
	ponds to be used as a water supply for livestock or for irrigation.
(3)	\$4,000,000 shall be used to assist farmers with the renovations of
	pastures that were depleted by the 2007 drought conditions.

	viability of the Green Industries.
