2	AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO IMPLEMENT HIGH PRIORITY
3	INITIATIVES WITHIN THE NORTH CAROLINA PUBLIC HEALTH
4	IMPROVEMENT PLAN, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE PUBLIC HEALTH
5	STUDY COMMISSION.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the
8	Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health, the sum of
9	eighty million one hundred thirty-four thousand four hundred thirty-six dollars
10	\$80,134,436) for the 2008-2009 fiscal year. Funds appropriated by this act shall be
11	used to supplement and not supplant existing State, federal, county, or other funds
12	illocated for the identified purpose. These funds shall be used to implement high
13	priority initiatives presented in the North Carolina Public Health Improvement Plan and
14	hall be allocated by the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public
15	Health, in the following amounts for the purposes indicated:
16	(1) \$23,000,000 as noncategorical General Aid to County funds to build
17	capacity for the 10 essential public health services in local health
18	departments statewide.
19	(2) \$12,500,000 to support community demonstration projects,
20	community grants, a public awareness campaign, and county
21	implementation of community-based programs that advance the goals
22	and objectives of "Eat Smart and Move More," North Carolina's
23	obesity prevention plan.
24	(3) \$1,500,000 to support operation of the Tobacco Quit Line.
25	(4) \$10,400,000 to hire additional school nurses to work toward the goal
26	of achieving a statewide school nurse to student ratio of 1:750.

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1	(5) \$31,317,772 to provide all CDC-recommended childhood vaccines to
2	all children in the State.
3	(6) \$1,416,664 to support improvements and ongoing operations of the
4	three existing regional medical examiner facilities.
5	<b>SECTION 2.</b> This act becomes effective July 1, 2008.
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
