A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE A SILVER ALERT TO BE ISSUED FOR A PERSON OF 3 ANY AGE, TO AUTHORIZE AND FUND THE PRODUCTION OF AN 4 EDUCATIONAL VIDEO, AND TO STUDY THE TRAINING NEEDS OF THE 5 JUDICIAL SYSTEM IN RESPONDING TO PERSONS WITH AUTISM, AS 6 RECOMMENDED BY THE JOINT STUDY COMMITTEE ON AUTISM 7 SPECTRUM DISORDER AND PUBLIC SAFETY.

8 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 9

SECTION 1. G.S. 143B-499.8(b) reads as rewritten:

10 If the Center receives a report that involves a missing person who is believed "(b) to be suffering from dementia or other cognitive impairment, for the protection of the 11 missing person from potential abuse or other physical harm, neglect, or exploitation, the 12 13 Center shall issue an alert providing for rapid dissemination of information statewide regarding the missing person. The Center shall make every effort to disseminate the 14 information as quickly as possible when the missing person is 18 years of age or older, 15 16 and the person's status as missing has been reported to a law enforcement agency."

The UNC-CH Division TEACCH Autism Program 17 SECTION 2. (TEACCH), in consultation with the School of Government and the Autism Society of 18 NC, shall develop a video to raise awareness of autism for those involved in 19 government and public service, including information on recognizing the signs and 20 symptoms of autism spectrum disorders, and contacts for further information on 21 22 appropriate responses to individuals with autism.

23 **SECTION 3.** The School of Government, in consultation with the Autism 24 Society of NC, TEACCH, and appropriate legal associations and organizations, shall study the various groups in the judicial system for which additional training may be 25 necessary on the legal issues and appropriate responses to persons with autism. The 26 study shall include judges, district attorneys, defense attorneys, guardians ad litem, 27 victim witness coordinators, magistrates, juvenile court counselors, and any other group 28

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in the judicial system identified as needing additional training. The School of 1 2 Government shall develop a proposal for the most appropriate way to deliver the 3 necessary training to each identified group and determine what funding, if any, is necessary to deliver the training. The School of Government shall report its findings to 4 5 the Joint Study Committee on Autism Spectrum Disorder and Public Safety no later 6 than October 1, 2008. 7 SECTION 4. The General Assembly shall appropriate funds for the 8 2008-2009 fiscal year to implement Section 2 of this Act.

SECTION 5. This act is effective when it becomes law.

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
