A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF BREVARD IS  
2 ELECTED TO A FOUR-YEAR TERM.  
3

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 **SECTION 1.** Section 2.2 of the Charter of the City of Brevard, being  
6 Chapter 415 of the 1981 Session Laws, reads as rewritten:

7 "Sec. 2.2. Mayor, Term of Office, Duties. The Mayor shall be elected by and from  
8 the qualified voters of the City for a term of ~~two~~ four years, in the manner provided by  
9 Article III of this Charter; provided, the Mayor shall serve until his successor is elected  
10 and qualified. The Mayor shall be the official head of the City government, shall preside  
11 at all meetings of the City Council, and shall have the powers and duties of Mayor as  
12 prescribed by this Charter and the General Statutes. The Mayor shall have the right to  
13 vote on matters before the Council only where there are an equal number of votes in the  
14 affirmative and in the negative."

15 **SECTION 2.** Section 2.6 of the Charter of the City of Brevard, being  
16 Chapter 415 of the 1981 Session Laws, reads as rewritten:

17 "Sec. 2.6. Vacancies. In the event a vacancy occurs in the office of the ~~Mayor,~~  
18 Mayor during the final two years of a regular term, the City Council may by majority  
19 vote fill it for the remainder of the term. In the event a vacancy occurs in the office of  
20 the Mayor during the first two years of a regular term, the City Council may by majority  
21 vote fill it until the next election, at which it shall be filled by the voters for the  
22 remaining two years of the term. In the event a vacancy in the office of Councilman  
23 occurs during the final two years of a regular term, the remaining members of the  
24 Council may by majority vote fill it for the remainder of the term. In the event a  
25 vacancy in the office of Councilman occurs during the first two years of a regular term,  
26 the remaining members of the Council may by majority vote fill it until the next  
27 election, at which it shall be filled by the voters for the remaining two years of the  
28 term."

1           **SECTION 3.** Section 3.2 of the Charter of the City of Brevard, being  
2 Chapter 415 of the 1981 Session Laws, reads as rewritten:

3           "Sec. 3.2. Election of the Mayor. At the regular municipal election in ~~1981, 2009,~~  
4 and every ~~two~~ four years thereafter, there shall be elected a Mayor to serve a term of  
5 ~~two~~ four years. The Mayor shall be elected by the qualified voters of the City voting at  
6 large."

7           **SECTION 4.** This act becomes effective January 1, 2009, and applies to  
8 mayoral elections conducted thereafter.
