(4)	Whether a person's youth at the time the person committed the crime	
	should be a factor in determining whether to allow the expunction of	
	the person's record.	
(5)	Whether a person's record since committing the crime should be a	
	factor in determining whether to allow the expunction of the person's	
	record.	
(6)	Any other issues the Commission considers relevant to this topic.
