A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO IMPLEMENT THE FUNDING RECOMMENDATION OF THE OFFICE OF STATE BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT CONCERNING IMPROVEMENT OF THE STATE'S GEOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION SYSTEM AND TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE GEOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION COORDINATING COUNCIL FOR THAT PURPOSE.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1.(a) Study Directive. – As directed by Section 6.13 of S.L. 2007-323, the Office of State Budget and Management (OSBM) completed a study of the State's geographical information system (GIS).

SECTION 1.(b) Governance Recommendations. – The Office of State Budget and Management made the following governance recommendations:

- (1) That the existing Management & Operations (M&O) Committee of the Geographic Information Coordinating Council (GICC) be tasked with the responsibility of setting and managing the Statewide GIS Strategy.
- (2) That the Center for Geographic Information and Analysis (CGIA) be tasked with the responsibility of coordinating the execution of the statewide GIS strategy and GICC policies and standards.
- (3) That the GICC, M&O, and the CGIA be provided with the authority to do the following:
 - a. Create, update, and enforce GIS-related standards for State agencies and collaborate with counties and local municipalities.
 - b. Establish statewide GIS roles and responsibilities for all agencies that develop and maintain GIS data and give GICC the authority to hold agencies accountable for updating framework plus other key data layers relating to GIS in State agencies.

1 c. Establish data stewards of framework and other key data layers
2 within State agencies.

- 3 (4) Establishment of a GIS Reserve account, by which OSBM would have
4 oversight to manage annual General Assembly appropriated funding
5 for framework data plus other key data layers; funding would be
6 allocated by the M&O Committee to agencies' data stewards. The
7 GICC, the CGIA, the OSBM, and the State agencies would identify
8 both the existing and required recurring funds for framework data
9 layer maintenance to establish the GIS Reserve account. The amounts
10 would be netted out for any anticipated cost share from federal or local
11 governments.

12 **SECTION 1.(c)** Organizational Recommendations. – The Office of State
13 Budget and Management made the following organizational, staffing, and fund model
14 recommendations:

- 15 (1) To move the CGIA and all of its responsibilities (currently under the
16 Department of Environment and Natural Resources) to the State Chief
17 Information Officer (CIO).
18 (2) Align the current CGIA Director to report directly to the State CIO.
19 (3) Leave agency GIS personnel in agencies.
20 (4) Subject to inclusion in the Governor's Recommended Budget for the
21 2008-2009 fiscal year, appropriate funding for additional CGIA
22 positions.
23 (5) Leave 15 positions as fee based to support the development of
24 multistate agency enterprise GIS product offerings.
25 (6) Subject to inclusion in the Governor's Recommended Budget for
26 2008-2009 fiscal year, appropriate funding for an additional OSBM
27 position for GIS Reserve oversight.

28 **SECTION 1.(d)** Infrastructure Recommendations. – The Office of State
29 Budget and Management made the following recommendations regarding infrastructure
30 and leveraging local and federal support:

- 31 (1) Subject to inclusion in the Governor's Recommended Budget for the
32 2008-2009 fiscal year, appropriate funding for a system architecture
33 plan and follow up with funding for implementation of that plan to
34 complete the NC OneMap vision.
35 (2) GICC and CGIA should coordinate a statewide flyover for
36 orthophotography both logistically and via funding across the different
37 levels of government.
38 (3) GICC and CGIA should implement an aggregate cost-share model that
39 has counties contributing fifty percent (50%), the State contributing
40 twenty-five percent (25%), and the federal government contributing
41 twenty-five percent (25%) for a leaf-off product based on the GICC
42 adopted orthophotography standard.
43 (4) Consideration should be given regarding the fifty percent (50%)
44 county participation to ensure counties with very high growth which

1 require more frequent orthophotography pay more of a share versus
2 counties with little to no growth who should pay a smaller share to no
3 share of the cost.

4 (5) Subject to inclusion in the Governor's Recommended Budget for the
5 2008-2009 fiscal year, either appropriate the sum of six hundred thirty
6 five thousand six hundred twenty-five dollars (\$635,625), which
7 amounts to the twenty-five percent (25%) share, to the GICC for the
8 State's participation or request the 911 Board to review the language
9 pertaining to the 911 Fund to consider specifically allocating monies
10 for the State flyover, or do both.

11 (6) GICC via the Department of Crime Control and Public Safety (CCPS)
12 should seek Homeland Security Grants to augment flyover dollars.

13 (7) State agencies, the GICC, and the CGIA should continue to
14 aggressively seek federal funding grants to fund GIS projects in
15 addition to orthophotography flyovers.

16 **SECTION 1.(e)** The Office of State Budget and Management made the
17 following recommendations regarding the consolidation of State GIS initiatives:

18 (1) Information Technology Projects using GIS should be reviewed by
19 CGIA to ensure no cross State government agency duplication and to
20 ensure that the business case has been made for the requested
21 investment. If multiple projects are solving the same problem, then an
22 enterprise offering should be considered and built by the CGIA.

23 (2) State agencies should evaluate consolidation opportunities to reduce
24 the number of servers if and where appropriate.

25 **SECTION 2.** Appropriation. – There is appropriated from the General Fund
26 to the Geographic Information Coordinating Council (GICC) the sum of six hundred
27 thirty-five thousand six hundred twenty-five dollars (\$635,625) for the 2008-2009 fiscal
28 year to fund improvements in the State's geographical information system consistent
29 with the report of the Office of State Budget and Management, dated February 2008,
30 made in accordance with Section 6.13 of S.L. 2007-323.

31 **SECTION 3.** Effective Date. – This act becomes effective July 1, 2008.
