SESSION LAW 2007-386
SENATE BILL 661

AN ACT TO AMEND ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL ELECTION LAWS
TO ALLOW CITIES WHICH ARE LOCATED IN MORE THAN ONE COUNTY
TO HAVE A CITYWIDE ELECTION FOR MIXED BEVERAGES.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 18B-600(e4)(2) reads as rewritten:

"§ 18B-600. **Places eligible to hold alcoholic beverage elections.**

(e4) Multicounty/City ABC Elections. – If a city is located in two or more counties, the following provisions shall apply:

(2) The city may hold a mixed beverage election if the city has at least 500 registered voters and a county in which a portion of the city is located operates ~~ABC stores~~ stores, or a municipality in either county in which the city is located operates an ABC store.

SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2007.

In the General Assembly read three times and ratified this the 28th day of July, 2007.
