2	AN ACT CLARIFYING THE STATUS OF POSITIONS IN THE OFFICE OF
3	INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SERVICES AS EXEMPT OR NONEXEMPT UNDER
4	THE STATE PERSONNEL ACT AND RELATING TO THE SELECTION AND
5	APPOINTMENT OF THOSE EMPLOYEES.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	<b>SECTION 1.</b> G.S. 126-5(c1) is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:
8	"(29) Deputy Chief Information Officers, General Counsel, and Chief Financial
9	Officer appointed by the State Chief Information Officer."
10	<b>SECTION 2.</b> G.S. 147-33.77(a) reads as rewritten:
11	"(a) The State Chief Information Officer may appoint a <u>one or more</u> Chief Deputy
12	Information Officer. Officers, a General Counsel, and a Chief Financial Officer, each of whom
13	is exempt from the State Personnel Act, except as to Articles 6 and 7 of Chapter 126 of the
14	General Statutes. The salary of the Chief Deputy Information Officer each of these exempt
15	employees shall be set by the State Chief Information Officer. The State Chief Information
16	Officer may appoint all employees, including legal counsel, select all other employees
17	necessary to carry out the powers and duties of the office. These employees office, each of
18	whom shall be subject to the State Personnel Act. Act, except any employees designated as
19	policy-making exempt under G.S. 126-5(c)."
20	<b>SECTION 3.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law.
