		<u>a.</u> <u>Be used solely for the purpose of renovating, replacing on the same</u>			
		site, or expanding an existing:			
		1. Nursing home facility,			
		2. Adult care home facility, or			
		3. <u>Intermediate care facility for the mentally retarded; and</u>			
		b. Not result in a change in bed capacity, as defined in			
		G.S. 131E-176(5), or the addition of a health service facility or any			
		other new institutional health service other than that allowed in
