2	AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE PURCHASER OF FORECLOSED PROPERTY SHALL
3	NOT DISPOSSESS OR EVICT A TENANT WHO RECEIVES SECTION 8
4	ASSISTANCE PRIOR TO THE EXPIRATION OF THE TENANT'S LEASE.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	SECTION 1. Article 2A of Chapter 45 of the General Statutes is amended by
7	adding a new section to read as follows:
8	"§ 45-21.27A. Purchaser subject to Section 8 lease and contract.
9	A sale or upset bid pursuant to this Article shall not terminate a rental agreement that was
10	entered into between the mortgagor and a tenant who receives assistance pursuant to Section 8
11	of the U.S. Housing Act of 1937 (42 U.S.C. § 1437f) prior to the commencement of the
12	foreclosure action. No order of possession shall be issued pursuant to G.S. 45-21.29 and no
13	summary ejectment action under Article 3 of Chapter 42 of the General Statutes shall
14	commence prior to the expiration of the rental agreement on the grounds that the tenant no
15	longer has the right or privilege to occupy the premises as a result of the sale or upset bid. A
16	purchaser of residential property in which a tenant who receives assistance pursuant to Section
17	8 of the U.S. Housing Act of 1937 (42 U.S.C. § 1437f) resides shall be subject to the housing
18	assistance payments contract for the tenant's dwelling unit."
19	SECTION 2. G.S. 45-21.29(k) reads as rewritten:
20	"(k) Orders for possession of real property sold pursuant to this Article, in favor of the
21	purchaser and against any party or parties in possession at the time of application therefor, may
22	be issued by the clerk of the superior court of the county in which the property is sold if all of
23	the following apply:
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25	(5) Ten days' notice has been given to the party or parties who remain in
26	possession at the time application is made, <u>unless the party or parties receive</u>
27	assistance under Section 8 of the U.S. Housing Act of 1937 (42 U.S.C. §
28	1437f), and in that case, the provisions of G.S. 45-21.27A shall apply or, in
29	the case of residential propertyrental property, containing 15 or more rental
30	units, 30_90 days' notice has been given to the party or parties who remain in
31	possession at the time the application is made.
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33	SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.



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
