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decision of the Hearing Unit is the final agency decision. Any person aggrieved by a decision 1 2 of the Hearing Unit pertaining to an adult care home resident discharge is entitled to immediate 3 judicial review of the decision in Wake County Superior Court or in the superior court of the 4 county where the person resides. The appellant shall file a petition for judicial review not later 5 than 30 days after the person is served with a written copy of the Hearing Unit decision. Within 10 days after the petition for judicial review is filed with the superior court, the appellant shall 6 7 serve copies of the petition by personal service or certified mail upon all parties who were 8 parties of record to the appeal to the Hearing Unit. Other parties to the appeal to the Hearing 9 Unit may file a response to the petition within 30 days after service. The Department as the 10 decision maker in the appeal to the Hearing Unit is not a party of record. Within 30 days after receipt of a petition for judicial review, the Department shall transmit to the superior court the 11 original or a certified copy of the official record in the appeal to the Hearing Unit, together with 12 13 the final agency decision. In reviewing the Department's final decision, the superior court shall 14 review the official record, de novo, and make findings of fact and conclusions of law. The 15 decision of the Department remains in effect during the pendency of review by the superior 16 court and any further review in the appellate courts. 17 The facility shall convene the adult care home resident discharge team to assist with (e) finding a placement for a resident if, at the time of notice of discharge, the destination is 18 19 unknown, the destination is not appropriate for the resident, or the destination is not acceptable 20 to the resident. The facility is not solely responsible for securing an appropriate discharge 21 destination. When the adult care home resident discharge team is convened at the request of a facility, the adult care home resident discharge team shall consult with that facility, as well as 22 23 the resident receiving the discharge notice and that resident's legal representative. Upon the 24 request of the resident or the resident's legal representative, the Regional Long-Term Care 25 Ombudsman shall serve as a member of the adult care home resident discharge team. The 26 facility requesting the adult care home resident discharge team to be convened shall notify the 27 resident and the resident's legal representative of this right. If an adult care home discharge 28 team is unable to find an appropriate discharge destination or unable to find a discharge 29 destination that is acceptable to the resident, the discharge decision shall be directed to the 30 Hearing Unit. The Hearing Unit shall determine an appropriate discharge destination within 60 31 days after the Hearing Unit receives notice that it is directed to determine an appropriate 32 discharge destination. 33 Meetings of the adult care home resident discharge team are not subject to the (f) 34 provisions of Article 33C of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes. All information and records 35 acquired by the adult care home resident discharge team in the exercise of its duties are 36 confidential unless all parties give written consent to the release of that information. If a discharge is under appeal or if the adult care home resident discharge team has 37 (g) 38 been convened and no decision has been made, the resident shall remain in the facility and shall 39 not be subject to discharge until an appropriate discharge destination that is acceptable to the 40 resident is located." 41 **SECTION 5.** G.S. 150B-1(e) is amended by adding a new subdivision to read: 42 "(18) Hearings provided by the Department of Health and Human Services to 43 decide appeals pertaining to adult care home resident discharges initiated by 44 adult care homes under G.S. 131D-4.8." 45 **SECTION 6.** This act becomes effective October 1, 2011.
