A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO MAKE SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF INSTRUCTION IN CPR AVAILABLE TO ALL STUDENTS WITH A PLAN TO PHASE IN COMPLETION OF CPR INSTRUCTION AS A HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENT BY 2015.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.** G.S. 115C-81(e1)(1) reads as rewritten:

"(e1) School Health Education Program to Be Developed and Administered.

(1) A comprehensive school health education program shall be developed and taught to pupils of the public schools of this State from kindergarten through ninth grade. This program includes age-appropriate instruction in the following subject areas, regardless of whether this instruction is described as, or incorporated into a description of, "family life education", "family health education", "health education", "family living", "health", "healthful living curriculum", or "self-esteem":

a. Mental and emotional ~~health~~; health.

b. Drug and alcohol abuse ~~prevention~~; prevention.

c. ~~Nutrition~~; Nutrition.

d. Dental ~~health~~; health.

e. Environmental ~~health~~; health.

f. Family ~~living~~; living.

g. Consumer ~~health~~; health.

h. Disease ~~control~~; control.

i. Growth and ~~development~~; development.

j. First aid and emergency care, including the teaching of cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and the Heimlich maneuver by using hands-on training with mannequins so that students ~~become proficient in order to~~ pass a test approved by the American Heart Association, or American Red ~~Cross~~; Cross. Schools shall use for this purpose an instructional program developed by the American Heart Association, the American Red Cross, or other nationally recognized programs that is based on the most current national evidence-based emergency cardiovascular care guidelines for CPR. Schools shall maintain documentation in an electronic database that students have successfully completed CPR instruction to meet Healthful Living Essential Standards. Successful completion of instruction in CPR



1                    shall be a requirement for high school graduation by the 2014-2015  
2                    school year.

3                    k.     Preventing sexually transmitted diseases, including HIV/AIDS, and  
4                    other communicable ~~diseases;diseases.~~

5                    l.     Reproductive health and safety ~~education; and~~ education.

6                    m.     Bicycle safety.

7                    As used in this subsection, "HIV/AIDS" means Human  
8                    Immunodeficiency Virus/Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome."

9                    **SECTION 2.** The State Board of Education shall work in cooperation with the  
10                    American Heart Association, the American Red Cross, and other nationally recognized  
11                    programs to develop a strategic plan to phase in successful completion of cardiopulmonary  
12                    resuscitation instruction as a requirement for high school graduation by the 2014-2015 school  
13                    year. The plan shall include costs of, and details regarding, procedures for:

14                    (1)     Obtaining and maintaining documentation regarding students who  
15                    successfully complete cardiopulmonary resuscitation instruction in the  
16                    eighth grade in accordance with the Healthful Living Essential Standards  
17                    previously adopted by the State Board of Education. Documentation efforts  
18                    shall be initiated during the 2012-2013 school year.

19                    (2)     Identifying students not successfully completing cardiopulmonary  
20                    resuscitation instruction through Healthful Living Essential Standards and  
21                    ensuring that those students successfully complete cardiopulmonary  
22                    resuscitation instruction through other appropriate formats pursuant to  
23                    G.S. 115C-81(e1)(1)j. Identification of students needing cardiopulmonary  
24                    resuscitation instruction and offering this instruction to those students shall  
25                    begin during the 2013-2014 school year.

26                    (3)     Requiring successful completion of cardiopulmonary resuscitation  
27                    instruction as a requirement for high school graduation by the 2013-2014  
28                    school year.

29                    The plan shall be implemented at the beginning of the 2014-2015 school year.

30                    The State Board of Education shall report on this plan to the Joint Legislative  
31                    Education Oversight Committee by December 15, 2013. The State Board of Education shall  
32                    report on plan implementation to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee by  
33                    October 15, 2015.

34                    **SECTION 3.** This act is effective when it becomes law and applies beginning with  
35                    the 2012-2013 school year.
