### A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 AN ACT TO REQUIRE AN ADDITIONAL PETITION BE SUBMITTED TO THE 3 MUNICIPAL INCORPORATIONS SUBCOMMITTEE, TO SET A TIME LIMIT ON 4 THE LIFE OF THE PETITIONS SUBMITTED TO THAT SUBCOMMITTEE, AND TO 5 MAKE TECHNICAL CORRECTIONS. 6
  - The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
    - SECTION 1. G.S. 120-163 reads as rewritten:

#### 8 "§ 120-163. Petition.Petitions.

- 9 The process of seeking the recommendation of the Municipal Incorporations (a) 10 Subcommittee is commenced by filing with the Municipal Incorporations Subcommittee the following: 11
- 12 aA petition signed by fifteen percent (15%) of the registered voters of the (1)13 area proposed to be incorporated, but by not less than 25 registered voters of that area, asking for incorporation. The voter shall sign the petition and also 14 clearly print that voter's name adjacent to the signature. The petition must 15 also contain the voter's residence address and date of birth. 16
- 17 A petition signed by each owner of fifteen percent (15%) of the parcels of (2) 18 real property in the area proposed to be incorporated, but by not less than 25 persons, asking for incorporation. The owner shall sign the petition and also 19 20 clearly print that owner's name adjacent to the signature. The petition must also contain the address of the real property owned by that owner. 21

The petition in subdivision (a)(1) of this section must be verified by the county 22 (b) board of elections of the county where the voter is alleged to be registered. The board of 23 elections shall cause to be examined the signature, shall place a check mark beside the name of 24 each signer who is qualified and registered to vote in that county in the area proposed to be 25 26 incorporated, and shall attach to the petition a certificate stating the number of voters registered 27 in that county in the area proposed to be incorporated, and the total number of registered voters 28 who have been verified. The county board of elections shall return the petition to the person who presented it within 15 working days of receipt. That period of 15 working days shall be 29 30 tolled for any period of time that is also either two weeks before or one week after a primary or 31 election being conducted by the county board of elections.

32 (b1) The petition in subdivision (a)(2) of this section must be verified by the county tax assessor of the county where the parcel of real property is located. The county tax assessor shall 33 cause to be examined the signature and shall place a check mark beside the name of each signer 34 who owns a parcel of real property in the area proposed to be incorporated. The county tax 35

assessor shall also prepare and shall attach to the petition a certificate stating the total number 1 2 of parcels of real property in the area proposed to be incorporated and the total number of 3 parcels for which the signatures of all owners of that parcel have been verified. For purposes of 4 this subsection, if deed title to a parcel of real property is held by more than one person, all 5 persons holding title to that parcel must be checked off by the county tax assessor in order for 6 that parcel to be counted in the total number of parcels of real property in the area proposed to 7 be incorporated that have been verified. The county tax assessor shall return the petition to the 8 person who presented it within 15 working days of receipt. 9 The petitionBoth petitions under subsection (a) of this section must include the same (c) 10 information regarding the following: 11 -aA proposed name for the city, a map of the city, a list of proposed services (1)12 to be provided by the proposed municipality, the names of three persons to 13 serve as interim governing board, a proposed charter, a statement of the 14 estimated population, assessed valuation, degree of development, population 15 density, and recommendations as to the form of government and manner of 16 election. The proposed municipality may not contain any noncontiguous 17 areas. 18 (2) The petition must contain a The same statement that the proposed 19 municipality will have a budget ordinance with an ad valorem tax levy of at 20 least five cents  $(5\phi)$  on the one hundred dollar (\$100.00) valuation upon all 21 taxable property within its corporate limits. The petitionmust contain a The same statement that the proposed 22 (3) 23 municipality will offer four of the following services no later than the first 24 day of the third fiscal year following the effective date of the incorporation: 25 (i) police protection; (ii) fire protection; (iii) solid waste collection or 26 disposal; (iv) water distribution; (v) street maintenance; (vi) street 27 construction or right-of-way acquisition; (vii) street lighting; and (viii) 28 zoning. In order to qualify for providing police protection, the proposed 29 municipality must propose either to provide police service or to have 30 services provided by contract with a county or another municipality that 31 proposes that the other government be compensated for providing 32 supplemental protection. The proposed municipality may not contain any 33 noncontiguous areas. 34 The petitioners must present to the Municipal Incorporations Subcommittee the both (d) 35 verified petition petitions from the county board of elections elections and the county tax 36 assessor. 37 (e) A petitionBoth petitions under subsection (a) of this section must be submitted 38 together to the Municipal Incorporations Subcommittee at least 60 days prior to convening of 39 the next regular session of the General Assembly in order for the Municipal Incorporations 40 Subcommittee to make a recommendation to that session." 41 **SECTION 2.** G.S. 120-164 reads as rewritten: 42 "§ 120-164. Notification. 43 (a) Not later than five days before submitting the petition petitions to the Municipal 44 Incorporations Subcommittee, the petitioners shall notify:notify all of the following: 45 The board or boards of county commissioners of the county or counties (1)46 where the proposed municipality is located; located. 47 All cities within that county or counties; and counties. (2)48 All cities in any other county that are within five miles of the proposed (3) 49 municipality of the intent to present the petition to the Municipal

Incorporations Subcommittee.

1	(b) The petitioners shall also publish, one per week for two consecutive weeks, with the
2	second publication no later than seven days before submitting the petition petitions to the
3	Municipal Incorporations Subcommittee notice in a newspaper of general circulation in the area
4	proposed to be incorporated of the intent to present the petition petitions to the Municipal
5	Incorporations Subcommittee."
6	<b>SECTION 3.</b> G.S. 120-165 reads as rewritten:
7	"§ 120-165. Initial inquiry.
8	(a) The Municipal Incorporations Subcommittee shall, upon receipt of the
9	petition, petitions, determine if the requirements of G.S. 120-163 and G.S. 120-164 have been
10	met. If it determines that those requirements have not been met, it shall return the petition
11	petitions to the petitioners. The Municipal Incorporations Subcommittee shall also publish in
12	the North Carolina Register notice that it has received the petition.petitions.
13	(b) If it determines that those requirements have been met, it shall conduct further
14	inquiry as provided by this Part."
15	<b>SECTION 4.</b> G.S. 120-166(b) reads as rewritten:
16	"(b) Subsection (a) of this section does not apply in the case of proximity to a specific
17	municipality if: if any of the following apply:
18	(1) The proposed municipality is entirely on an island that the nearby city is not
19	<del>on;<u>on</u>.</del>
20	(2) The proposed municipality is separated by a major river or other natural
21	barrier from the nearby city, such that provision of municipal services by the
22	nearby city to the proposed municipality is infeasible or the cost is
23	prohibitive, and the Municipal Incorporations Subcommittee shall adopt
24	policies to implement this subdivision; subdivision.
25	(3) The municipalities within the distances described in subsection (a) of this
26	section by resolution express their approval of the incorporation;
27	<del>or</del> incorporation.
28	(4) An area of at least fifty percent (50%) of the proposed municipality has
29	petitioned for annexation to the nearby city under G.S. 160A-31 within the
30	previous 12 months before the incorporation petition ispetitions are
31	submitted to the Municipal Incorporations Subcommittee but the annexation
32	petition was not approved."
33	SECTION 5. G.S. 120-169.1(b) reads as rewritten:
34	"(b) Services. – The Municipal Incorporations Subcommittee may not make a positive
35	recommendation unless the area to be incorporated submits a plan for providing a reasonable
36	level of municipal services. This plan shall be based on the proposed services stated in the
37	petition petitions under G.S. 120-163(c)."
38	SECTION 6. G.S. 120-170 reads as rewritten:
39 40	"§ 120-170. Findings as to services.
40	The <u>Commission</u> <u>Municipal Incorporations Subcommittee</u> may not make a positive
41	recommendation unless it finds that the proposed municipality can provide at a reasonable tax
42 43	rate the services requested by the petition, petitions, and finds that the proposed municipality
43 44	can provide at a reasonable tax rate the types of services usually provided by similar
44 45	municipalities. In making findings under this section, the <u>Commission Municipal</u>
43 46	<u>Incorporations Subcommittee</u> shall take into account municipal services already being provided."
40 47	SECTION 7. G.S. 120-171 reads as rewritten:
47 48	"§ 120-171. Procedures if findings made.
48 49	(a) If the Commission Municipal Incorporations Subcommittee finds that it may not

1 the General Assembly shall list the grounds on which a negative recommendation is made, 2 along with specific findings. If a negative recommendation is made, the Commission Municipal 3 Incorporations Subcommittee shall notify the petitioners of the need for a legally sufficient 4 description of the proposed municipality if the proposal is to be considered by the General 5 Assembly. At the request of a majority of the members of the interim board named in the 6 petition, petitions, the Commission Municipal Incorporations Subcommittee may conduct a 7 public hearing and forward any comments or findings made as a result of that hearing along 8 with the negative recommendation. 9 If the Commission-Municipal Incorporations Subcommittee determines that it will (b) 10 not be barred from making a positive recommendation by G.S. 120-166 through G.S. 120-170, 11 it shall require that petitioners have a legally sufficient description of the proposed municipality 12 prepared at their expense as a condition of a positive recommendation. 13 If the Commission-Municipal Incorporations Subcommittee determines that it is not (c) 14 barred from making a positive recommendation, it shall make a positive recommendation to the 15 General Assembly for incorporation. 16 The report of the Commission Municipal Incorporations Subcommittee on a petition (d) 17 shall be in a form determined by the Commission to be useful to the General 18 Assembly. Assembly and shall be valid for two years from the date issued. 19 The Municipal Incorporations Subcommittee shall notify the Commission of all (e) 20 reports issued under this Part." 21 SECTION 8. G.S. 120-172 reads as rewritten: 22 "§ 120-172. Referendum. 23 Based on information received at the public hearing, the Commission-Municipal 24 Incorporations Subcommittee may recommend that any incorporation act passed by the General 25 Assembly shall be submitted to a referendum, except if the petition contained the signatures of 26 fifty percent (50%) of registered voters the Commission Municipal Incorporations 27 Subcommittee shall not recommend a referendum." 28 SECTION 9. G.S. 120-173 reads as rewritten: 29 "§ 120-173. Modification and life of petition. 30 (a) With the agreement of the majority of the persons designated by the petition 31 petitions as an interim governing board, the Commission-Municipal Incorporations 32 Subcommittee may submit to the General Assembly recommendations based on deletion of 33 areas from the petition, petitions as long as there are no noncontiguous areas. 34 The petitions submitted under G.S. 120-163 shall be valid and modifiable for three (b) 35 years from the date of submission. After three years from the date of submission, the petition 36 may not be modified under this section or considered by the Municipal Incorporations Subcommittee." 37 38 SECTION 10. G.S. 120-174 reads as rewritten: 39 "§ 120-174. Deadline for recommendations. 40 If the petition is timely received under G.S. 120-163(e), the Commission-Municipal 41 Incorporations Subcommittee shall make its recommendation to the General Assembly no later 42 than 60 days after convening of the next regular session after submission of the 43 petition.petitions pursuant to G.S. 120-163." 44 SECTION 11. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to petitions

45 submitted to the Municipal Incorporations Subcommittee on or after September 1, 2013.
