SENATE BILL 647*

Short Title: Stock Car Racing Theme Plate Proceeds. (Public)

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT THE DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES SHALL
2 TRANSFER THE MONEY IN THE COLLEGIATE AND CULTURAL ATTRACTION
3 PLATE ACCOUNT DERIVED FROM THE SALE OF STOCK CAR RACING THEME
4 PLATES TO THE NORTH CAROLINA MOTORSPORTS FOUNDATION, INC., OR
5 SPEEDWAY CHILDREN'S CHARITIES.

7 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

8 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 20-81.12(b38) reads as rewritten:

9 "(b38) Stock Car Racing Theme. – The Division may issue any plate in this series without
10 a minimum number of applications if the person providing the State with the license to use the
11 words, logos, trademarks, or designs associated with the plate produces the plate for the State
12 without a minimum order quantity.

13 The cost of the Stock Car Racing Theme plate shall include all costs to produce blank plates
14 for issuance by the Division. Notwithstanding G.S. 66-58(b), the Division or the Division of
15 Adult Correction of the Department of Public Safety may contract for the production of the
16 blank plates in this series to be issued by the Division, provided the plates meet or exceed the
17 State's specifications including durability and retroreflectivity, and provided the plates are
18 manufactured using high-quality embossable aluminum. The cost of the blank plates to the
19 State shall be substantially equivalent to the price paid to the Division of Adult Correction of
20 the Department of Public Safety for license tags, as provided in G.S. 66-58(b)(15).

21 The Division shall transfer quarterly the money in the Collegiate and Cultural Attraction
22 Plate Account derived from the sale of Stock Car Racing Theme plates to the North Carolina
23 Motorsports Foundation, ~~Inc.~~, or Speedway Children's Charities."

24 **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
