## SESSION LAW 2016-28 HOUSE BILL 970\*

AN ACT AUTHORIZING CRIMINAL RECORD CHECKS OF ANY CURRENT OR 1 2 PROSPECTIVE EMPLOYEES, VOLUNTEERS, OR CONTRACTORS OF THE OFFICE 3 OF STATE CONTROLLER, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE 4 OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE ON GENERAL GOVERNMENT. 5 6 7 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 8 SECTION 1. G.S. 143B-426.39 reads as rewritten: 9 "§ 143B-426.39. Powers and duties of the State Controller. 10 The State Controller shall: 11 12 (18)Require a criminal history record check of any current or prospective employee, 13 volunteer, or contractor, which shall be conducted by the State Bureau of Investigation as provided in G.S. 143B-966. The criminal history report shall be 14 provided to the State Controller and is not a public record under Chapter 132 of 15 the General Statutes.' 16 17 **SECTION 2.** Subpart D of Part 4 of Article 13 of Chapter 143B of the General 18 Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read as follows: 19 "§ 143B-966. Criminal record checks for the Office of State Controller. 20 The Department of Public Safety may provide to the Office of State Controller from the State 21 and National Repositories of Criminal Histories the criminal history of any current or prospective 22 employee, volunteer, or contractor of the Office of State Controller. The Office of State Controller 23 shall provide to the Department of Public Safety, along with the request, the fingerprints of the 24 current or prospective employee, volunteer, or contractor, a form signed by the current or 25 prospective employee, volunteer, or contractor consenting to the criminal record check and use of 26 fingerprints and other identifying information required by the State and National Repositories, and 27 any additional information required by the Department of Public Safety. The fingerprints of the 28 current or prospective employee, volunteer, or contractor shall be forwarded to the State Bureau of 29 Investigation for a search of the State's criminal history record file, and the State Bureau of 30 Investigation shall forward a set of fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a 31 national criminal history record check. The Office of State Controller shall keep all information 32 obtained pursuant to this section confidential. The Department of Public Safety may charge a fee 33 to offset the cost incurred by it to conduct a criminal record check under this section. The fee shall 34 not exceed the actual cost of locating, editing, researching, and retrieving the information.
