	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO LIMIT THE GOVERNOR AND THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LIFETIME MAXIMUM OF TWO TERMS. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1. Section 2 of Article III of the North Carolina Constitution rewritten: "Sec. 2. Governor and Lieutenant Governor: election, term, and qualifications.	
	Qualifications. No person shall be eligible for election to the office of Gove Lieutenant Governor unless, at the time of his election, he the person shall have attained of 30 years and shall have been a citizen of the United States for five years and a residuhis State for two years immediately preceding his election. No person elected to the office of Governor or Lieutenant Governor shall be eligible for election to be elected Governor Lieutenant Governor to more than two consecutive terms of twice to the same office." SECTION 2. The amendment set out in Section 1 of this act shall be submit the qualified voters of the State at the general election in November 2018, which election be conducted under the laws then governing elections in the State. Ballots, voting systems both may be used in accordance with Chapter 163 of the General Statutes.
