General Assembly Of North Carolina Session 2017 1 Uses of Monies in the Fund. – The monies in the Fund may be used only for forgivable (c) 2 loans granted under the Program, administrative costs associated with the Program, including 3 recruitment and recovery of funds advanced under the Program, and extracurricular enhancement 4 activities of the Program. The Authority may use up to two hundred fifty thousand dollars 5 (\$250,000) from the Fund in each fiscal year for its administrative costs, the salary of the Director 6 of the Program, and expenses of the Commission. The Commission may use up to three hundred 7 fifty thousand dollars (\$350,000) each fiscal year for the extracurricular enhancement activities of 8 the Program. 9 (d) Director of the Program. - The Board of Governors of The University of North 10 Carolina shall appoint a Director of the Program. The Director shall appoint staff to the 11 Commission and shall be responsible for recruitment and coordination of the Program, including proactive, aggressive, and strategic recruitment of potential recipients. Recruitment activities shall 12 13 include (i) targeting regions of the State with the highest teacher attrition rates and teacher 14 recruitment challenges; (ii) actively engaging with educators, business leaders, experts in human 15 resources, elected officials, and other community leaders throughout the State; and (iii) attracting 16 candidates in STEM and special education licensure areas to the Program. The Authority shall 17 provide office space and clerical support staff, as necessary, to the Director for the Program. 18 Student Selection Criteria for Forgivable Loans. - The Commission shall adopt (e) stringent standards for awarding forgivable loans based on multiple measures to ensure that only 19 20 the strongest applicants receive them, including the following: 21 (1) Grade point averages. 22 (2) Performance on relevant career and college readiness assessments. 23 Experience, accomplishments, and other criteria demonstrating qualities (3)24 positively correlated with highly effective teachers, including excellent verbal 25 and communication skills. 26 <u>(4)</u> Demonstrated commitment to serve in a STEM or special education licensure 27 area in North Carolina public schools. Program Selection Criteria. - The Authority shall administer the Program in 28 (f) 29 cooperation with five institutions of higher education with approved educator preparation 30 programs selected by the Commission that represent both postsecondary constituent institutions of 31 The University of North Carolina and private postsecondary institutions operating in the State. 32 The Commission shall adopt stringent standards for selection of the most effective educator 33 preparation programs, including the following: 34 Demonstrates high rates of educator effectiveness on value-added models and (1) 35 teacher evaluations, including using performance-based, subject-specific 36 assessment and support systems, such as edTPA or other metrics of evaluating candidate effectiveness that have predictive validity. 37 38 Demonstrates measurable impact of prior graduates on student learning, (2)39 including impact of graduates teaching in STEM or special education licensure 40 areas. 41 Demonstrates high rates of graduates passing exams required for teacher (3) 42 licensure. 43 <u>(4)</u> Provides curricular and co-curricular enhancements in leadership, facilitates 44 learning for diverse learners, and promotes community engagement, classroom 45 management, and reflection and assessment. Requires at least a minor concentration of study in the subject area that the 46 (5) 47 candidate may teach. 48 Provides early and frequent internship or practical experiences, including the (6)49 opportunity for participants to perform practicums in diverse school 50 environments.

hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) in nonrecurring funds to be used to implement the North 1 2 Carolina Teaching Fellows Program (Program), as established by this section, and (ii) for the 3 2018-2019 fiscal year, the sum of six million dollars (\$6,000,000) in recurring funds to be used for 4 the operation of the Program and for the award of forgivable loans to selected recipients beginning 5 with the 2018-2019 academic year. 6 SECTION 2. G.S. 116-209.27(a) reads as rewritten: 7 "(a) The Authority shall, as of March 1, 2015, administer all outstanding scholarship loans 8 previously awarded by the former North Carolina Teaching Fellows Commission and subject to 9 repayment under the former Teaching Fellows Program. Program administered pursuant to Part 2 10 of Article 24C of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes." 11 **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2017.
