A majority of the Task Force members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. The Task Force may contract for consultant services. The 28 29 appointing authority shall fill vacancies on the Task Force. 30 The Task Force, while in the discharge of its official duties, has the power to request (f) 31 all officers, agents, agencies, and departments of the State to provide any information, data, or 32 documents within their possession, ascertainable from their records, or otherwise available to 33 them. 34 Beginning January 1, 2018, and biennially thereafter, the Task Force shall submit a 35 report to the Governor and to the General Assembly containing recommendations to reduce 36 poverty and increase economic recovery. Beginning January 1, 2019, and biennially thereafter, 37 the Task Force shall determine whether there has been a reduction in poverty in the State. 38 When the Task Force determines that poverty has been reduced by at least fifty percent (50%) 39 from the effective date of this act, the Task Force shall make a final report to the Governor and 40 the General Assembly to that effect. The Task Force shall terminate upon filing the final report. "§ 143-771. Member expenses and travel reimbursements. 41 42 Members of the Task Force shall serve without compensation but may receive travel and 43 subsistence as follows: 44 Members who are officials or employees of a State agency or unit of local (1) 45 government, in accordance with G.S. 138-6. 46

SECTION 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Human Services the sum of one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) for the

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 2017-2018 fiscal year and the sum of one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) for the 2018-2019 fiscal year to fund the work of the Task Force pursuant to this act.

SECTION 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Human Services the sum of one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) for the 2017-2018 fiscal year and the sum of one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) for the 2018-2019 fiscal year to fund the salaries and support costs associated with two new personnel positions in that Department dedicated to staffing the Task Force and implementing the interdepartmental collaboration among State agencies, departments, and institutions to advance poverty reduction and economic recovery in the State.

SECTION 4. This act becomes effective July 1, 2017.
