General Assembly Of North Carolina

The Department of Justice shall provide to the North Carolina Naturopathic Doctors 1 (a) 2 Certification Board from the State and National Repositories of Criminal Histories the criminal 3 history of an applicant for certification by the Board or a certified naturopathic doctor of the 4 Board. The North Carolina Naturopathic Doctors Certification Board shall provide to the 5 Department of Justice, along with the request, the fingerprints of the applicant or certified naturopathic doctor, a form signed by the applicant or certified naturopathic doctor consenting 6 to the criminal history record check and use of fingerprints and other identifying information 7 8 required by the State and national repositories, and any additional information required by the 9 Department of Justice. The fingerprints of the applicant or certified naturopathic doctor shall be forwarded to the State Bureau of Investigation for a search of the State's criminal history record 10 11 file, and the State Bureau of Investigation shall forward a set of fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history record check. The North Carolina 12 13 Naturopathic Doctors Certification Board shall keep all information obtained pursuant to this 14 section confidential. 15 The Department of Justice may charge a fee to offset the cost incurred by it to (b) 16 conduct a criminal history record check under this section. The fee shall not exceed the actual 17 cost of locating, editing, researching, and retrieving the information." 18 SECTION 4. Notwithstanding the provisions of G.S. 90-735, as enacted by Section 1 of this act, the initial naturopathic doctors appointed to the North Carolina Naturopathic 19 20 Doctors Certification Board must be North Carolina residents, must be licensed as a 21 naturopathic doctor in a state, district, territory, or province that licenses this profession, and 22 must be eligible for certification under G.S. 90-737, as enacted by Section 1 of this act. Upon 23 appointment, the appointee must immediately seek to become certified under this act. 24 **SECTION 5.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
