A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO DEDICATE AND ACCEPT CERTAIN PROPERTIES AS PART OF THE
STATE NATURE AND HISTORIC PRESERVE AND TO REMOVE CERTAIN LANDS
FROM THE STATE NATURE AND HISTORIC PRESERVE.

Whereas, Section 5 of Article XIV of the North Carolina Constitution authorizes the
dedication of State and local government properties as part of the State Nature and Historic
Preserve upon acceptance by a law enacted by a three-fifths vote of the members of each house
of the General Assembly and provides for removal of properties from the State Nature and
Historic Preserve by a law enacted by a three-fifths vote of the members of each house of the
General Assembly; and

Whereas, the General Assembly enacted the State Nature and Historic Preserve
Dedication Act, Chapter 443 of the 1973 Session Laws, to prescribe the conditions and
procedures under which properties may be specifically dedicated for the purposes set out in
Section 5 of Article XIV of the North Carolina Constitution; and

Whereas, more than 7,900 acres have been added to the State Parks System since
the last dedication and acceptance of properties as part of the State Nature and Historic
Preserve pursuant to a petition to the Council of State dated May 6, 2014; and

Whereas, in accordance with G.S. 143-260.8, on April 4, 2017, the Council of State
voted to petition to the General Assembly to enact a law pursuant to Section 5 of Article XIV
of the North Carolina Constitution to dedicate and accept properties added to the State Parks
System and designated in the petition for inclusion as parts of the State Nature and Historic
Preserve; and

Whereas, as a part of its petition of April 4, 2017, the Council of State also
requested the General Assembly to remove certain properties from the State Nature and
Historic Preserve; and

Whereas, G.S. 113-44.14 provides for additions to, and deletions from, the State
Parks System upon authorization by the General Assembly; Now, therefore,
The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 143-260.10 reads as rewritten:

"§ 143-260.10. Components of State Nature and Historic Preserve.

The following are components of the State Nature and Historic Preserve accepted by the
North Carolina General Assembly pursuant to G.S. 143-260.8:

- (1) All lands and waters within the boundaries of the following units of the State
Parks System as of ~~May 6, 2014~~: April 4, 2017: Baldhead Island State
Natural Area, Bay Tree Lake State Park, Natural Area, Bear Paw State
Natural Area, Beech Creek Bog State Natural Area, Bullhead Mountain

19 Lawrence (RLS) and Bennie R. Smith (RLS), entitled "Property of The State
20 of North Carolina William B. Umstead State Park", dated January 14, 1977
21 and filed in the State Property Office, which was removed from the State
22 Nature and Historic Preserve by Chapter 450, Section 1 of the 1985 Session
23 Laws. The tract excluded from the State Nature and Historic Preserve under
24 this subdivision is deleted from the State Parks System in accordance with
25 G.S. 143B-135.54. The State of North Carolina may only exchange this land
26 for other land for the expansion of William B. Umstead State Park or sell
27 and use the proceeds for that purpose. The State of North Carolina may not
28 otherwise sell or exchange this land.

47 Park containing 13.85 acres, and being 100 feet to the east and 150
48 feet to the west of a centerline shown on a survey by Witherspoon
49 Surveying PLLC, dated February 9, 2007, and filed in the State
50 Property Office. The State of North Carolina may grant a temporary
51 easement to Duke Energy Corporation across this tract to facilitate

- 1 the Catawba Dam Embankment Seismic Stability Improvements
2 Project. The grant of the easement within Lake James State Park to
3 Duke Energy Corporation under this sub-subdivision constitutes
4 authorization by the General Assembly that the described tract of
5 land may be used for a purpose other than the public purposes
6 specified in Article XIV, Section 5, of the North Carolina
7 Constitution, Article 25B of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes, and
8 Part 32 of Article 7 [Article 2] of Chapter 143B of the General
9 Statutes. The State of North Carolina may use the proceeds from the
10 easement only for the expansion or improvement of Lake James State
11 Park or another State park. The State may not otherwise sell or
12 exchange this land.

17 entitled "Lake James State Park," Sheet 1 of 2, recorded in Plat Book
18 4, Page 275 of the McDowell County Registry, for a 40-foot
19 right-of-way beginning at the southwest corner of Tract B and
20 continuing along the southern boundary 86 38' 51" E for 400 feet to
21 the now or former John D. Walker property. The State of North
22 Carolina may grant an easement across this tract to extinguish
23 prescriptive easements on Tract B to improve management of the
24 State park property. The State may not otherwise sell or exchange
25 this land. The easement excluded from the State Nature and Historic
26 Preserve under this subdivision is deleted from the State Parks
27 System pursuant to G.S. 143B-135.54.
- 28 c. That portion of that certain tract or parcel of land at Lake James State
29 Park in Burke County, Linville Township, described in Deed Book

33 Property Office. The tracts excluded from the State Nature and

44 containing 48,210 square feet and being the portion of this tract shown as
45 new R/W and permanent utility easement on drawing prepared by State of
46 North Carolina Department of Transportation entitled "Map of Proposed
47 Right of Way Property of State of North Carolina (Parks and Recreation)
48 Columbus County" for Tip B-3830 on SR 1947 (Bella Coola Road) done by
49 John E. Kaukola, PLS No. 3999 and compiled 1-18-2008, and filed with the

12 by Kimley-Horn and Associates for the North Carolina Department
13 of Transportation and revised October 26, 2007, and filed with the
14 State Property Office. The portion of that certain tract or parcel of

34 2008, and revised March 11, 2009. The State of North Carolina may grant an
35 easement to Piedmont Natural Gas Company across this tract to facilitate the
36 transmission of natural gas. The grant of the easement within the
37 Mountains-to-Sea Trail to Piedmont Natural Gas Company under this
38 section constitutes authorization by the General Assembly that the described
39 tract of land may be used for a purpose other than the public purposes
40 specified in Section 5 of Article XIV of the North Carolina Constitution,
41 Article 25B of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes, and Part 32 of Article 7
42 [Article 2] of Chapter 143B of the General Statutes. The State of North
43 Carolina may use the proceeds from the easement only for the expansion or
44 improvement of the Mountains-to-Sea Trail or another State park. The State
45 may not otherwise sell or exchange this land.

7 the proceeds for that purpose. The State may not otherwise sell or exchange
8 this land.

9 (24) All State-owned land and waters within the boundaries of Lower Haw State
10 Natural Area as of ~~May 6, 2014~~, April 4, 2017, with the exception of the
11 following tract: the portion of that certain tract or parcels in Chatham
12 County, described in Deed Book 1319, Page 1047, containing 12,501 square
13 feet and shown on a survey entitled "Recombination Survey for the North
14 Carolina Division of Parks and Recreation and PK Ventures I LTD
15 Partnership" prepared by S.D. Puckett and Associates dated April 22, 2014,
16 and on file with the State Property Office. The tract excluded from the State
17 Nature and Historic Preserve under this subdivision is deleted from the State
18 Parks System in accordance with G.S. 143B-135.54. The State of North
19 Carolina may only exchange this land for other land for the expansion of
20 Lower Haw State Natural Area or sell this land and use the proceeds for that
21 purpose. The State may not otherwise sell or exchange this land.

22 (25) All State-owned land and waters within the boundaries of Lumber River
23 State Park as of ~~May 6, 2014~~, April 4, 2017, with the exception of the
24 following tracts:

25 a. The portions of those certain tracts or parcels of land in Robeson
26 County, described in Deed Book 919, Page 862, Deed Book 1097,
27 Page 837, Deed Book 935, Page 170, Deed Book 1125, Page 562,
28 and Deed Book 1117, Page 680, containing a total of 3.39 acres for
29 the North Carolina Department of Transportation secondary road
30 project 6C.078030 SR 2245 (VC Britt Road) and shown on the
31 survey entitled "Survey of Tracts 1A and 1B, VC Britt Rd, Orrum
32 NC" prepared by the North Carolina Department of Transportation.
33 The tracts excluded from the State Nature and Historic Preserve
34 under this subdivision are deleted from the State Parks System in

3 (Mitchell Mill Road) bridge No. 162 replacement project and on file with the
4 State Property Office. The tract excluded from the State Nature and Historic
5 Preserve under this subdivision is deleted from the State Parks System in
6 accordance with G.S. 143B-135.54. The State of North Carolina may only
7 exchange this land for other land for the expansion of the State Parks system
8 or sell this land and use the proceeds for that purpose. The State may not
9 otherwise sell or exchange this land.

10 (27) All lands and waters within the boundaries of Carvers Creek State Park as of
11 April 4, 2017, with the exception of the following tract: The portion of that
12 certain tract or parcel of land at Carvers Creek State Park in Cumberland
13 County, described in Deed Book 8466, Page 67, and containing 0.33 acres,
14 more or less, as shown on the survey entitled "Ingress-Egress Easement for
15 Stone Mountain Farm, LLC & William C. Elliott, Estate & The State of
16 North Carolina" by George L. Lott, PLS, dated November 2013, and revised
17 in May 2015 and filed with the State Property Office."

18 **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
