BILL SUMMARY:

Section 1 of this bill would repeal S.L. 2016-99 and S.L. 2016-3. This bill would be effective when it becomes law.

ASSUMPTIONS AND METHODOLOGY:

At the time of publication of this fiscal note, the repeal of S.L. 2016-3 and S.L. 2016-99 would have no direct fiscal impact on the State. To date, Fiscal Research Division has not found any record of federal funds being withheld from the State or from any state due to similar legislation. This bill would likely circumvent the risk of a potential loss of federal funds due to currently pending legal action by the federal government alleging violations of compliance with the Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, and the Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act of 2013. These statutes authorize federal agencies to withhold funds due to lack of compliance after certain due process is met. Following a motion by the Justice Department, determination of the status of a stay is pending in the ongoing legal action.
