6	SECTION 1. G.S. 7A-228 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:
7	"(b2) <u>A superior or district court judge, magistrate, or clerk of superior court authorizing</u>
8	person to appeal to district court as an indigent pursuant to subsection (b1) of this section sha
9	to at least one of the following:
10	(1) Make written findings including (i) all criteria listed in G.S. 1-110 that led t
11	the authorization of the person to appeal to district court as an indigent an
12	(ii) all information or evidence used to determine that one or more criteria
13	<u>G.S. 1-110 existed.</u>
14	(2) Make written findings indicating (i) that authorization of the person to appe
15	to district court as an indigent was not based upon criteria listed in G.S. 1-11
16	and (ii) all information or evidence used to determine that the person would
17	be authorized to appeal to district court as an indigent."
18	SECTION 2. The Administrative Office of the Courts shall modify Administrative
19	Office of the Courts Form AOC-G-106 to reflect the statutory requirements created by Section
20	of this act.
21	SECTION 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Administrativ
22	Office of the Courts the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) in nonrecurring funds for the
23	2024-2025 fiscal year to be used to implement the changes required by Section 2 of this act an
24	to train judicial personnel and other court stakeholders regarding the statutory changes made i
25	Section 1 of this act.
26	SECTION 4. Sections 1 and 2 of this act become effective October 1, 2024, and
27	apply to appeals entered on or after that date. The remainder of this act becomes effective July
28	2024.
