## **General Assembly Of North Carolina**

SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2024. Except as provided in
subsection (b) of Section 1 in this act, subsection (a) of Section 1 of this act applies to applications
for the award of funds beginning in the 2024-2025 academic year.
