<b>SECTION 5.</b> Section 6(d) of S.L. 2018-32 is amended by adding a new subdivision
to read:
"(5c) G.S. 115C-83.31(a)(4), To require each senior to complete and submit the
Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) as a graduation
requirement."  SECTION 6. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
Public Instruction the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) in nonrecurring funds for
the 2024-2025 fiscal year to be used to train, educate, and prepare public school units regarding
the requirements of this act.
<b>SECTION 7.</b> Section 6 of this act becomes effective July 1, 2024. The remainder of
this act is effective when it becomes law, and Sections 1 through 5 of this act apply beginning
with the 2025-2026 school year.
