SECTION 2.(a) No later than June 30, 2025, the Friday Institute shall report to the		
Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee the findings of the study conducted pursuant		
to Section 1 of this act.		
SECTION 2.(b) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of		
Governors of The University of North Carolina the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) in		
nonrecurring funds for the 2024-2025 fiscal year to be allocated to the Friday Institute at North		



Carolina State University to facilitate the study conducted pursuant to Section 1 of this act and

issue the report required under subsection (a) of Section 2 of this act.

**SECTION 3.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
