30		SECT	ION 1.(b) This section is effective October 1, 2024, and app	lies to insurance	
31	contracts issued, renewed, or amended on or after that date.				

SECTION 2. Effective with the January 1, 2025, plan coverage year, the Board of Trustees for the State Health Plan for Teachers and State Employees (State Health Plan) shall remove any annual or lifetime limitations on the coverage for ovulation medication and ovulation induction cycles for services offered in-network under the State Health Plan. Any limitation on



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coverage for ovulation medication shall not be different than the limitations imposed on other
prescription medications.

SECTION 3. Effective July 1, 2024, there is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Insurance the sum of two million five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000) in nonrecurring funds for the purposes of implementing Section 1 of this act, including any associated education campaigns directed toward consumers or insurers about the coverage

changes or review of health benefit insurance contracts and policies offered in this State forcompliance with that section.

9 **SECTION 4.** Except as otherwise provided, this act is effective when it becomes 10 law.
